The first relates to the successful sales of toys at our shop. Alan Hurst has been searching the Internet and has come up with a large number of ideas for simple wooden toys. Some of these could be used to extend the range items the Toy Group produce, but what would be more important would

be for some individual members to take some of the ideas on board and produce their own toys for sale at our various sales throughout the year.

The second follows comments re small items. Regardless of which area of woodwork you are interested in, it is a good idea to spend some time working on smaller items. This gives you a chance to practise particular techniques that might be needed in more complicated projects.

Understanding the tools we use. English Woodturner #326 had an interesting article on 'The advantages of modern tool steels and grinders' p.68. A number of us started with carbon steel chisels, now we love the HS Steel chisels. We also find there is a variation in the HS Steel chisels – M2, M4 & M42. And for sharpening, a CBN wheel. Interesting that later in the magazine it shows that Hamlet has brought out bowl and spindle gouges in M42 HSS, Crown, Henry Taylor and Carter and Son (USA) also use M42 HSS.

I'd like to pass on thanks to those members who, during our 'break', have been working behind the scenes ensuring that our facilities are clean and equipment is in good working order so that workshops can proceed as smoothly as possible.

To finish, I'd like to remind all members that, if possible, it is worth attending the Club's monthly General meeting. Not just for the free Sausage Sizzle before hand but also for the interesting Demonstration/ Guest Speaker at the conclusion of the meeting. The February meeting finished with a great presentation on how to turn a three-cornered bowl, by John DiStefano. As there will be no March meeting, the April meeting will conclude with a special presentation by the two Neils.

THE HISTORY OF THE FOB



There have been many questions about what a FOB is since I used the term at the general meeting! The following is an historical perspective of the origins of 'The FOB'

"A fob can be defined as a short strap attached to an object to make the object easier to handle. The watch fob is a good example (see photo). Small decorative objects attached to the strap are also called fobs. Sometimes they are used to identify the object; key fobs are a good example of this use. Today, small devices attached to keys are sometimes called fobs.

Before World War I, when wristwatches became available, personal watches were carried in pockets. They were attached to short straps that could be leather, ribbon, or metal chain. The strap made it easier to remove the watch from the pocket and easier to handle the watch securely.

Men usually carried their watch in a small pocket on the waistcoat, called a fob pocket. Around 1775, waistcoats had several pockets, and for a time it was fashionable to carry a watch in each pocket. Sometimes only one watch was functional, while the others were merely decorative. The fobs hanging from each pocket became quite elaborate, and small personal seals were often attached to the free end."

The modern interpretation of "The FOB" is:

A key fob is a small electronic security device with built-in authentication protocols or mechanisms to allow whoever possesses it to enter a secured network or location in order to access data or services. A key fob is designed to be small so that it can be carried around inconspicuously just like a key chain, hence the name key fob.


