





**BUSINESS ARISING**

The log slabbing project has been completed and went very well. The new chains proved very effective. Three logs produced a dozen or so slabs and brought \$400 to the club. The owner now has another log he would like slabbed some time. Thanks to Owen for the oil can.

The two new chains cost \$200. It was recommended that thr club buy new chains whenever redgum is to be cut and the cost factored into the fee.

Graham Nancarrow reported that the Western Woodies event at Hahndorf was a very successful social occasion for the participants although not quite so good financially.

Reminder about the Christmas function. Members need to decide which menu they wish to choose. They are also reminded about the Kris Kringle ( to the value of \$10) and the wood swap for turners and scrollers.

There was a brief discussion on installing solar panels. The general feeling was that we do not use enough power to make it economically worthwhile.

Possibly we could consider applying for a grant for a reverse cycle air conditioner. Gordon will get an indication of the probable cost.

**GENERAL BUSINESS**

John Rowe pointed out that our club constitution indicates that the committee followed correct procedure in the purchase of the new bandsaw.

Program: Tom has a list of activities for the scrollers for the coming year. It was proposed that the committee make a provisional program for the turners and put it to members for comment..

Luke has offered to take over Alan's role on the Lucas mill. He also has another log available for slabbing.

Gordon would like to see another demo on the use of the Dremel system.

Meeting closed at 10.30.

## SHOW AND TELL

Wally showed a jarrah platter, finished with beeswax, which he has made as a wedding present. He also had a clock, made for his great grand daughter, onto which he had transferred photos of the girl and her great grandmother. He explained the transfer process and fired the imagination of several members.

Tom again showed his scrolling skills with his “bald man’s comb”, “Love that tune” in camphor laurel, and a treble clef music symbol cut in red cedar.

John T showed his recent purchase of a Gifkins dovetail jig.

Graham N presented a coloured resin “sea scene”. As a result of carrying it upright before the resin had completely set some of the resin slumped giving it a very effective “3D” effect on the waves. Obviously mistakes can sometimes be fortuitous.
