Safety Tip for September

For your power leads to last a long while without a problem you need to look after them. Don't drive over them. void cuts and abrasions that damage the insulation. Don't lay a lead on wet ground. If you store a lead on a drum or frame, unwind it completely before using it. There are ways to fold them so they won't tangle. If you look online! It works just as well to roll a lead up in a loop about an arm span and go in a clockwise direction, have the lead unplugged from both ends. This allows any twists to be flicked out of the lead. When finished insert the plug in the socket. For extra safety you can have your leads Test and Tagged.

When working with power leads you should have a RCD in use also. Either in the garage or hard wired in the house.

On appliance leads of small appliances and battery chargers. If they have short leads if you hang them up this will stop most of the twisting and kinks. Figure 8 leads very easily develop twists and tangles.
